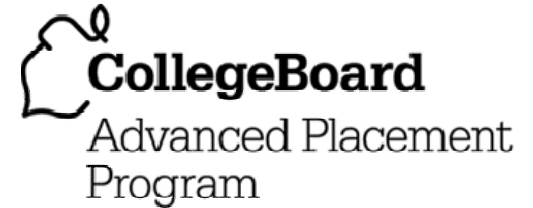

Faculty

AP Biology

Charlotte St. Romain taught AP Biology at Marksville High School and St. Thomas Moore Catholic High School in Lafayette for 10 years. She was an AP Biology reader for nine years. She has been and is currently a faculty consultant for the College Board, leading workshops and institutes for AP Biology since 1996. She is currently employed at Louisiana State University in Environmental Studies and works closely with Biological Sciences.

AP Calculus

Patsy Young Davis taught Calculus at Lake Mary High School for 19 years. She was an AP Calculus reader, table leader, and question leader for 12 years and has been a consultant for the College Board since 1989. From 1992-1998, she was associated with the Calculus Connections Project, headed by Dr. Tom Dick of Oregon State University. She holds a Bachelor of Arts degree from the State College of Arkansas and a Master of Science degree in mathematics from the University of Arkansas.

AP English Language and Composition

Robert Kuhn has been a teacher for 31 years and currently teaches in Winston-Salem, NC (Career Center). He received his BA from Pfeiffer College, NC, and his MA from Bread Loaf School of English, Middlebury, Vt. He has 20 years experience with the AP English Language course, eight years experience as an AP Reader (Lang.), and has been a Table Reader since 2005. He is an AP Workshop consultant for the Southeast region.

AP English Literature and Composition

Rebecca Brown received her BA from Wake Forest University and her MA from New York University. She was Co-Director of the National Writing Project at Wake Forest University from 1987 to 2003. Ms. Brown has been a College Board consultant since 1986, and a Reader and Table Leader for AP Literature. She taught high school English for thirty-seven years and was an AP teacher for twenty-five of those years. She is currently an adjunct professor at High Point University.

AP Physics

J. Patrick Polley attended St. Joseph's University in Philadelphia, PA, where he obtained a degree in philosophy in 1975.

After a five-year stint as a copy editor and production manager at TV Guide magazine, he returned to graduate school at the University of Florida for a Ph.D. in Physics. He taught at Rollins College before moving to Beloit College where he is currently a professor of physics. He worked on the reading of the AP Physics exams from 1987 until 2005, beginning as a Reader and ending with a seven-year stint as Chief Reader.

Pre AP English

Christine Sanderson is an AP English Language teacher at Archbishop Chapelle High School in Metairie Louisiana. An English teacher for 29 years, she has taught AP Language since 1988. She has been a reader for the AP English Language exam since 1996 and a consultant with the College Board since 2001. She is also a reader for the writing portion of the SAT. In addition to teaching AP,

Christine is also a reviewer for VOYA magazine, a publication dedicated to adolescent literature. She has a BA and an MA in English and an additional certification as a school librarian.

Pre AP Mathematics

Vivian Stephens has taught mathematics in public schools for 31 years. She has also taught mathematics at the college level and supervised teacher candidates during their field experience for the college teacher-training program. She currently teaches mathematics part-time with Christian Heritage School in Dalton, Ga. Mrs. Stephens received her B.S. Ed. from the University of Georgia in 1976, her M.Ed. from Georgia State University in 1983, and her Ed. S. from Georgia State University in 1991. She has been a College Board Consultant since 1999. She has presented workshops at NCTM and Georgia Council of Teachers of Mathematics conferences and taught many staff development courses for the Dalton Public School System. Mrs. Stephens has received numerous awards for the teaching of mathematics and was named one of the three Georgia Secondary Mathematics State finalists for the Presidential Awards for Excellence in Mathematics and Science Teaching in 1998.

AP U. S. History

Gene Pickel has both a Bachelor and Master of Arts degree in history with concentrations in Nineteenth Century American history. His thesis, *A History of Roane County, Tennessee to 1860*, has been published. Gene began teaching Advanced Placement United States History at Oak Ridge High School in 1967. Gene has been a consultant for the College Board since 1981, conducted one-day workshops and Summer Institutes for AP history teachers at various schools, colleges and universities, and has served on several College Board committees.
